## **Start a team and join Relay For Life**

Relay For Life LaPorte County is an amazing event that creates fun ways to raise money for the American Cancer Society (ACS). Relay For Life actually encourages teams to compete against one another to see who can raise the most money for ACS. ACS utilizes the money raised for cancer research and awareness. There are also many programs funded by ACS to assist those fighting cancer.

In addition to raising money for an exceptional cause, Relay can serve as a great way to TEAM BUILD with your employees, family and friends. Below are 10 easy steps for how to get started.

1. Pick a team name and register online anytime after Sept 1, 2016: [www.relayforlife.org/laportecountyin](http://www.relayforlife.org/laportecountyin)
2. Attend Captain Meetings  
We hold monthly meetings and to keep you informed and answer your questions. Everything you need to know about Relay and more. (see reverse side for meeting dates).
3. Set some simple goals.  
Team members. Set a goal of getting 15 co-workers, friends & family to join in the fun.  
Fund Raising. Set a goal of \$100 per team member (that also gets them a free t-shirt).
4. Select a Theme  
The 2017 Theme for LaPorte County Relay is “Shining Stardom on Survivors, Closing the Book on Cancer” (Movies or Books). Pick your favorite movie or book and incorporate it into all you do. At the event there are competitions to see who can decorate their campsite to best reflect their theme, best character, crazy hat, baton, etc. (see pictures on re verse side)
5. Start raising money NOW!  
The competition starts NOW! Hold a car wash, bake sale, Tupperware party, trivia contests, etc.
6. Determine fundraisers for the event  
Decide on games, food and/or wares you can sell on the day of the event. Get donations for the silent auction held the day of the event.
7. Recruit Survivors  
We love to celebrate and honor those that fight against cancer. A free dinner is provided to survivors at the event.
8. Set your walking schedule  
One team member must be on the track at all times between 10am until 6am to represent how cancer never sleeps and neither do we.
9. Make a packing list
10. Attend the event and have a BLAST!!
