South Dakota Goes Smoke-free This Summer

The Midwest Division is excited to announce South Dakota is going smokefree! On March 19, Governor Mike Rounds signed the smoke-free bill into law, joining Iowa and Minnesota as the third smoke-free state in the division. The law goes into effect on July 1, 2009, and includes all bars, restaurants, video lottery establishments and Deadwood casinos. Congratulations to the South Dakota staff who worked tirelessly to move this grassroots effort forward.

Tobacco use and secondhand smoke has cost South Dakota more than \$500 million a year in health care and other costs. The new smoke-free law will save lives and taxpayer money by reducing the risk of heart attacks, cancers and a host of other respiratory illnesses caused by secondhand smoke. South Dakota joins 24 other states nationwide that have passed statewide smoke-free laws as a matter of public health.


Looking to the future, a Midwest Division legislative priority for 2009 is a smoke-free Wisconsin. The American Cancer Society urges the Wisconsin Legislature to protect local control of tobacco regulation, and support strong statewide legislation that protects all citizens and employees from the cancer causing chemicals in secondhand smoke. Currently, **Wisconsin spends \$2 billion on health care costs related to smoking, while more than two-thirds of Wisconsinites support a comprehensive statewide law.**

Ruth Parriott, Vice President-Government Relations, recently told the Midwest Division Board of Directors, "The Midwest Division has an amazing track record when it comes to advocating for smoke-free legislation. Starting with Minnesota in 2007, one Midwest Division state has gone smoke-free in each of the last three years (2008-lowa, 2009-South Dakota). And now it's 'On Wisconsin!'"
