

Lodging Assistance

Having cancer is hard. Finding a place to stay while traveling for treatment shouldn't be. The American Cancer Society partners with local hotels across the country to provide rooms for cancer patients and their caregivers traveling for treatment.

The American Cancer Society Hotel Partners Program can help ease some of the financial burdens that cancer patients and their families face.

Eligibility

To be eligible to receive lodging through the program, patients must:

- Be traveling for a cancer-related medical appointment.
- Be in need of lodging near their treatment center.
- Have a permanent residence.
- Be able to care for their personal needs or travel with a companion who can assist them.

Children younger than 18 years old must be supervised by a responsible adult at all times.



Program Guidelines

- Participating hotels provide rooms on a space-available basis, Sunday through Thursday nights. Exceptions for other nights may be made if there is a medical necessity and space is available. On occasion, rooms may not be available because of demand.
- Room requests must be made in advance of the date that lodging is needed. In cities with high demand, more advance notice may be necessary.
- Requests for smoking rooms are not accepted.
- Patients who require specialized sterilized environments or medical assistance cannot be accommodated.
- Requests for hotels allowing pets are accepted and depend on hotel availability.
- Rooms are complimentary when and if available. Additional hotel-related charges (meals, phone calls, parking) are the personal responsibility of each guest. A credit card is required at check-in.
