
Help Us Plan Our 2017 Relay!

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A New Website that Empowers Cancer Survivors During & After Treatment

The American Cancer Society and the National Cancer Institute have launched an easy-to-use website to help cancer survivors during and after cancer treatment -- Springboard Beyond Cancer.

The website provides survivors with online tools to manage side effects from cancer treatment, cope with stress, improve healthy behaviors, communicate better with their health care teams, and ask for support from family and friends.

<u>Springboard Beyond Cancer</u> lists dozens of common symptoms and side effects from cancer treatment – such as fatigue, hair loss, and anxiety – and offers advice and resources for dealing with them. Visitors to the site can



download "cards" that summarize each topic. Additional topics include getting more exercise, quitting smoking, and other ways to develop a healthier lifestyle. They also include practical advice about talking to family and friends – including children – about your cancer, questions to ask your doctor and health care team, and understanding your rights in the workplace.

Cancer Moonshot Program to Arm Oncologists with New Tools

The <u>Cancer MoonShot 2020</u> program brings together stakeholders from pharma, community and academic oncology, as well as government and scientific communities in an effort to accelerate the potential of combination immunotherapy as the next-generation standard of care in cancer patients.

It is the first program to test the hypothesis that the immune system has the ability to defeat cancer. Until recently, major advances in cancer medicine involved targeted therapy, in which a particular drug targeted a change in DNA and immunotherapy. However, these treatments were often separated. Cancer MoonShot will bring both concepts together, and multiple partners will be able to conduct testing in real patients to see if the combination results in greater cures.

The program's goal is to initiate randomized phase 2 trials in 20,000 patients at all stages of disease in 20 tumor types before 2020, called the Quantum Integrative Lifelong Trial (QUILT). These findings will be used to develop an effective vaccine-based immunotherapy to combat cancer by 2020.

The joint approach provides researchers with necessary testing materials and patients with more opportunities to participate in trials through local facilities and wider insurance coverage. Oncologists receive real-time clinical trial results, and patients have hope for more positive outcomes.
