

2015 Basic Relay For Life On Site Do's & Don'ts

No vehicles are allowed in the track and campsite area at any time. There will be a drop area to unload your team gear and we will have golf and utility carts manned by volunteers to help transport your things to your campsite. Please park your car in the designated areas in an orderly fashion so that people can leave throughout the evening without restrictions.

Campfires are permitted this year, but they must be off the ground in a raised campfire ring. Also this year charcoal grills are permitted. There will be metal "ASH" cans provided to put your spent briquettes, etc. into. Do not put them in the regular trash cans or spread the ashes onto the grounds. Propane grills, heaters, etc. are permitted. If you are cooking anything on a grill put a tarp or a piece of cardboard under the grill to catch and absorb any spills, etc.

No alcohol or tobacco products are allowed at the Relay event.

No pets. If it is a service animal make sure it has the proper identification and paper work.

Just before relay, keep an eye on the weather to dress and bring the appropriate clothing, etc. Some years the overnight temperature has been in the 60's and shorts and t-shirts were just right. Other years the night has been cold and rainy. Relay will go on no matter the weather.

The campsites are 15' across x 20' deep. Keep all guide wires, etc. within your designated area. There are no electrical hook ups. Things must be run off of battery power or "quiet" generators. All generators must be turned off during the luminary ceremony.

Where do you place your luminaries? Place your team's luminaries in front of your campsite, but off of the track. When setting up remember to allow some space for them. Do not place them in front of other campsites. Some teams may have to double row their luminaries. Some teams will only have a few and others will have quite a lot. Remember that as in years past the luminaries will be held in place by a can of food that will be donated the next morning to the Blue Ridge Area food bank. This is a WIN-WIN for both charities!

There will be Trash and Ash cans in place at various locations. Please use them as intended. Do not place things in the wrong receptacle. Also if a can is full don't try to overstuff it. We will do our best to keep them emptied during the evening. Do not place heavy things in them. In years past we have had teams throw bags of ice in them. Ice can be set out in the grass to melt.

After the closing ceremony vehicles will be allowed to enter the campsite area to start taking down your Relay site. Be mindful of your vehicle so as not to block your fellow Relay participants.

We hope to leave the Expo property in perfect condition and let them know that we are glad to have them as a Relay partner. So let's do our best to leave a good impression.
