

Road to Recovery Race



This year, Bartow's Relay for Life event will feature the Road to Recovery Car Show & Race! This can be a really important part of the Relay, since it not only provides a really fun group activity, it also brings to focus an important part of what Mission Delivery is trying to accomplish at the Relay:

Educate participants and attendees about the American Cancer Society's Road to Recovery program and the importance of recruiting volunteer drivers to get patients to/from treatments. One of the great needs of local cancer services is to provide patients with drivers who can help get people to and from their medical visits. Recruitment of drivers is a critical part of providing services, since many people have no other way to get to their appointments. The average time for the volunteer is one-two hours each appointment.

Rules of the Bartow County Road to Recovery Car Show and Race

The Car Show

- Your car should be made of a cardboard box large enough to hold at least one person.
- Your car may be no larger than 4' x 8' and should have four complete sides.
- Your car may only be powered by human power – channel your inner Flintstone!
- Your car must be completed **prior** to arriving at the event.
- Your car must have at least one message or image on it related to Relay For Life, ACS, or fighting cancer.
- The cars will be on display at your campsite until the Race.
- Only one car per team will be judged.

Awards that will be distributed:

- Most Creative Car – simply, the car that is the most eye-catching; voted upon by a team made of committee members and other ACS representatives.
- Fighting Spirit Car – the car that demonstrates the ACS mission in the best way; voted upon by a team made of committee members and other ACS representatives.
- People's Choice – everyone in attendance will be allowed to vote via donation into jars placed at each campsite. At the end of the competition timeline, the jars will be collected and counted and the team that raises the most donated money will be

announced the winner. All money donated for each team will be credited to their overall team total after the event.

The Race

- Our race will consist of three age ranges. Your team may choose to participate in as many as you'd like, and you only need one car to participate.
 1. Ages 10 and Under
 2. Ages 10-20
 3. Ages 20 and Up
- The winners of each race will receive points towards their campsite judging, a certificate, and a prize.
- The top three racers in each race will go head to head in a final lap to decide the Overall Race Winner and grand prize recipient.

Teams are responsible for taking their cars with them at the end of the event, or breaking down and disposing of them on their own.
