Here are some points to remember when putting your basket together:

- No actual alcohol—try a gift card to a local store or have the item in our vehicle to distribute after the bidding has closed.
- Make sure you have a list to display of all the items in the basket.
- It is a good idea to have the fair market value (or estimate) available—we list it on the bid sheet we will supply for each item. And, let us know if you have a preferred starting bid.
- Your donation does not have to be “in” a basket; a separate item is just fine and it doesn't have to be fancy!
- One basket is a good on-site fundraiser; 2 or more is great; but don't feel obligated to submit a basket—we are just giving your team an additional outlet to raise funds!

If you have items and just don't know how to display/present them, don't worry! This year we have a Silent Auction Leader. Lora is more than happy to meet you, collect your items, and put it together for you. She will even take care of transporting & delivering it to the event! (Way to go Lora!)
