WHAT TO BRING RELAY NIGHT





Camera, video camera and batteries

Lawn/beach chairs and tables

Umbrellas and rain gear (even though we won't need it)

Warm clothes for overnight including jacket, extra shoes and socks

Flashlights

Insect repellent

Trash bags ***Every team needs to bring their own***

Personal first aid kit including medicine (prescription and/or over-the-counter)

Theme lap outfits

Blankets, sleeping bags and pillows (this is for warmth-trust me you will not have time to sleep)

Pocket money for on-site activities

Sunscreen, sunglasses, and hats

Toiletries

Cooler with extra water/drinks and snacks for your campsite

Pop-up canopies and small tents for shelter

Starter money and cash box if you are holding an on-site activity

Campsite decorations and team banner

Scissors, tape, pens and tools for random tasks

Wagon/hand truck

If you need assistance from the American Cancer Society, please call 1-800-227-2345.

Please understand that the day before event day and the morning of the event the committee will be on location and unlikely to answer questions until you arrive. Think ahead and try to get your questions answered well before event week.

If you have questions or run into problems on event day:

- 1.) Head to the Registration booth. Our wonderful registration volunteers should be able to answer most of your questions. If not, they will find the proper person to assist you.
- 2.) Look for someone wearing a blue committee shirts
- 3.) In the event of an emergency/missing child, please head to the stage or registration.
- 4.) A first aid kit will be located at the registration tent.
- 5.) Please immediately report any injuries to the registration booth who will contact Judith Keeler to complete an incident report.

UNLOADING ZONE

You can start unloading your supplies and setting up your campsite at 12:00pm



You will only have **20 minutes** to unload your car.

Please remember that we hope to have over 50 teams, which means there are a lot of cars that want to be near their campsite to unload. Please unload your items and then move your car to the parking lot before setting up.

Bring a hand truck/wagon to help take your things to your campsite.

Vehicles are not permitted to unload on the grass at any anytime.

There is ample handicap parking which is located close to the field.

If you arrive late, please do not set up your campsite during opening ceremonies.

PARKING

There is plenty of parking and ample handicap spots.

Do not park in the handicap spots unless you have a handicap permit.

Please be courteous and follow ALL instructions that will be given by our parking staff and security.

Important - DO NOT LEAVE TRASH IN THE PARKING LOTS.

If every area isn't completely clean then it will cost our event extra money!

Please check around your vehicles and make sure you haven't left any trash.

EVENT & CAMPSITE RULES

No wheeled vehicles are allowed on the track at any time.

No bikes or scooters are allowed on the track at any time.

No pets allowed. We love dogs, but for the safety of all, please leave your furry friends at home.

No bare feet are permitted on the track.

Due to safety regulations, the track lights must remain on at all times. These lights will be reduced during overnight hours.

Subject to availability, teams may extend their campsite area as long as the adjoining team does not object.

Gas grills and portable stoves will be allowed (no solid fuel). Wood or charcoal fires are not allowed.

Each team is responsible for regularly emptying trash into a dumpster and disposing of all trash at the end of Relay. Your area must be cleaned up before leaving. Bring lots of trash bags!

If you are selling food items you must adhere to the Health Department's Rules and Regulations.

In the event of an electrical storm, you will be instructed to proceed to the school's cafeteria.

In case of fire emergency, fire extinguishers and hoses are located in the Registration Tent.

All RV's and campers must stay in the parking lot area (not allowed on the track).

Security is provided by ACS. If an emergency arises, please contact Security Personnel or go to the stage area and ask the DJ to page Judith Keeler, and call 911 if needed.

CAMP SITE AND TRACK INFO

Completed map will be posted on social media and emailed.

CHECKING IN YOUR TEAM

The registration tent will open at 12:00pm

Team captains MUST check in their team at the Registration tent prior to setting up your campsite.

Team Captains should:

- 1) Verify your campsite number(s) and location in case changes have been made to the map.
- 2) Pick up your team packet(s) and event programs. If you have not already received them
- 3) Pick up your team t-shirts (if you did not get them before event day).
- 4) Turn in any money! Please don't wait until the last minute to turn in any donations.

LUMINARIA CEREMONY



What is the Luminaria Ceremony is a gathering of the community and loved ones to support and remember those lost to cancer and to honor those whose fight continues. As the sun sets, luminaria lining the track light up the night, reminding us all why we fight back against the disease.

Please observe silence during the luminaria ceremony.

Each Luminaria bag is personalized with a name, photo, message or drawing in memory of a friend or loved one who has been affected by cancer. Each luminaria represents a person – a mother, father, sister, brother, aunt, uncle, niece, newphew, friend or co-worker – who has been touched by cancer.

You may purchase a luminaria bag by completing a luminaria order form. To obtain a form see any member of a Relay For Life of West Anne Arundel County team. The suggested luminaria donation is \$10 each. Your donation is tax-deductible. Checks should be made payable to American Cancer Society.

On the day of the event, you may obtain a luminaria order form from the Luminaria Tent.
