



What to Bring to Relay:

- Canopy tent/shade
- Camping Tents/Pillows/Sleeping Bags
(If you think you might sleep!)
- Outdoor chairs & tables
- Wagon/Dolly to help haul supplies to your site
- Walking shoes!
- Blankets/Jackets/Extra Clothing & Socks
(Even in May, it gets surprisingly chilly overnight)
- Campsite decorations/banner
- Entertainment for your site
(board games, cards, instruments, etc)
- Sunscreen/Bug Spray/Hats or sun visors
- Umbrellas, Galoshes, Rain coats
(We WILL Relay during anything short of thunderstorms!)
- Battery-powered flashlights and lanterns
- Plastic bags for trash/keeping belongings dry when the morning dew hits!
- Donations to be turned in
- Extra money!! (for the on-site fundraisers/concessions)
- Supplies for your on-site fundraiser
- Camera to capture the day
- Your Relay Enthusiasm!

What NOT to bring:

- Snacks or drinks (concession stand open all night!)
- Alcohol
- Cigarettes and tobacco products
- Pets (service animals are welcome)

Parking

You are welcome to park in the lots surrounding the high school, or on the access road that runs behind the football field. [This road can be entered by turning off Lambs Rd. onto Lambs Lane (toward Jouett & Greer schools) & heading left toward the field.]
