

## Youth Teams – Helpful Hints

- ◆ Each youth on a team must raise \$100 by bank night in order to spend the night. Youth who fail to raise this amount are welcome to attend, they just can't spend the night. The \$100 does not include Luminaria. Money can be raised individually or by doing a team fundraiser.
- ◆ Each youth team member is required to wear a security bracelet all evening. Security bracelets will be available to pick up on Sat. morning at the youth bracelet booth for those who have met all the necessary requirements.
- ◆ You will need to check in with Jennifer Thompson, youth coordinator to make sure you have done all you need to get your team's wrist bands.
- ◆ Each youth team must have 1 chaperone for every 10 members of their team during curfew hours. At least 1 of the curfew hour chaperones must be 25 or older. During the day, there must be at least 1 chaperone on the grounds at all times. All chaperones must be at least 21 yrs.old.
- ◆ Chaperones are completely responsible for the youth in their care and must know where they are at all times. During curfew hours, youth are only allowed on the track, in the bathroom or at midnight madness activities. Chaperones are responsible for making sure students follow rules/policies.
- ◆ Students are asked to volunteer if they are asked to help out by a committee person.
- ◆ Co-ed teams must have separate tents for girls and boys.
- ◆ If you have students that don't have their money by bank night but come to the event with it, they must bring the envelope to registration, get a receipt from them for the \$ amount in the envelope and take that receipt to the team chaperone. The chaperone must accompany that student to the wrist band booth to get a bracelet. You must add the student's contact information to the emergency contact list at that time. If you are expecting in advance that they will come through, you can add them to the list early but the wrist band booth attendant will still need to check and make sure it's on there.
- ◆ Each youth team is required to provide the following paperwork by bank night (the earlier you can turn this in the better):
  - A signed youth participant form for every youth
  - A signed chaperone form for each chaperone on the team (1 chaperone per 10 youth)
  - An emergency contact form for the whole team – contact information must be for a parent or guardian.
  - A participant registration form for any team member that doesn't sign up online
  - Campsites will not be assigned till all the paperwork is in. Campsites must be assigned by bank night. No sites will be assigned at the event.
