Sharlene Foster, a middle school art teacher, has battled breast cancer twice while continuing work and inspiring her students every day. Her dedication and determination are an inspiration to all at Palmer Middle School.

Robin Jefferson, described as person with huge love for people and an incredible faith in God. In 2010 she was diagnosed with ovarian cancer, quickly began treatments, continuing to be strengthened by her faith. She was tired, and her hair thinned and fell out, but Robin kept working with the children's ministry and kept smiling.

Michael Reid, after being faced with the adversity of a tumor on his Ocular Nerve and his subsequent loss of sight, the reality that his sight will not return, the long road of chemotherapy and radiation, and the need to learn to cope as a blind man to complete his high school requirements, Michael tackled the challenges head-on.

Shannan Smith, owner of a Barber Shop in Kennesaw, she has participated in Cobb's Relay since 2002. In 2011 after offering to donate a kidney to a friend in need, she discovered that she had melanoma. 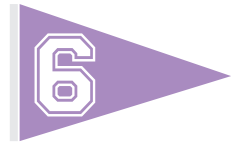

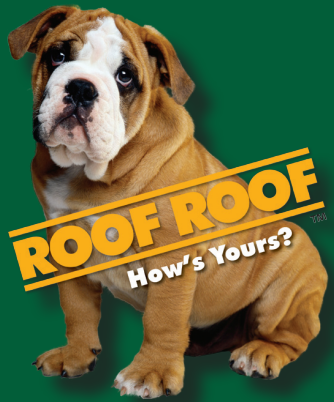

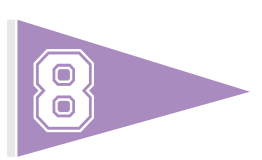
