

A Ripe Idea: Choosing Local Produce

Do you know where your fruits and vegetable have been? More and more of the produce you see at your supermarket has traveled significantly before finding its place



on store shelves. While that may mean you can buy strawberries when they're not in season locally, that convenience could take a toll on your health and on the environment.

It is estimated that most produce travels more than 1,500 miles before it reaches your table. Transporting foods across the country or from abroad increases pollution and could affect your food's nutrient value. Transporting foods such long distances also take a significant amount of fuel and energy, which can be a concern in an ever more "green" society.

So how can you make sure the produce you choose is good for your family and for the environment? The National Resources Defense Council (NRDC) offers these tips.

- Support your local farmer market. Many parts of the country offer year-round markets or weekly events where local grower can show off their wares.
- Check the label on produce at your supermarket and choose local fruit and vegetables when you can

Remember, too, that eating lots of fruits and vegetables is an important way to reduce your risk for serious diseases, including cancer.

For many people who attend Relay For Life, one of the most moving parts of the event is the Ceremony of Hope. All represent a person who has been profoundly affected by cancer and the family and friends who continue to be touched by that experience.



Would you like to honor someone with a luminaria at a Relay For Life Ceremony of Hope? You too can help spread the light of hope and honor or remember those in your life who have been touched by this disease.

You can honor a cancer survivor by placing their name under "In Honor of," or you can remember someone who was lost to cancer by placing the name under "In Memory of." Each individual's name will appear on a luminaria bag and each will be lit at the ceremony to shine as a beacon of hope for others.

Please light a candle in honor of or in memory of a friend or loved one who has had cancer. Your contribution will help save lives, give hope, and empower people through the American Cancer Society and its lifesaving mission.
