About Misster Relay & ACS

Misster Relay is more than just a fun, humorous fundraising event for the American Cancer Society's Relay For Life. It is a way in which men honor the women & others in their lives diagnosed with cancer, putting a smile on their face and raising much needed funds to support programs and services used during their cancer journey. In addition to three Cancer Resource Rooms in Central Florida (ACS office in Winter Park; CFRH in Sanford & ORMC in Kissimmee) which offer wigs, hats, scarves and educational materials FREE to cancer patients we also have many valuable programs including:

Look Good, Feel Better

Getting help with appearance-related side effects of treatment is what the Look Good, Feel Better program is all about. Trained volunteer cosmetologists teach women how to cope with skin changes and hair loss using cosmetics and skin products donated by the cosmetic industry. For patients unable to attend a group session, the American Cancer Society offers At-home materials (step-by-step guide, virtual makeover tool, 30 minute DVD) for women by calling 1.800.395.LOOK. There is also an At-home brochure for men and an interactive teen section on the LGFB website.

Reach to Recovery

If you have breast cancer, you may want to talk to someone who knows what you're feeling—someone who has "been there". Through our Reach to Recovery program, we can match you with a volunteer who will talk with you about coping with your breast diagnosis and treatment. Through face-to-face visits or by phone, Reach to Recovery volunteers provide support to individuals who are Facing a possible breast cancer diagnosis, recurrence or advanced-stage breast cancer; Considering or having had a lumpectomy, mastectomy or breast reconstruction; Experiencing lymphedema, or Undergoing or have completed treatment including chemotherapy and radiation.

"tlc" (Tender Loving Care)

"tlc" is the American Cancer Society's catalog and website for women coping with the appearance-related effects of cancer. It offers helpful information and affordable products, including wigs, hairpieces, breast forms, mastectomy bras, hats, turbans, mastectomy swimwear, and accessories. All proceeds from product sales are reinvested into the American Cancer Society's programs and services for patients and survivors.

Road to Recovery

Every day, cancer patients need rides to treatment. Some may not be able to drive themselves and family and friends cannot always help. Our Road to Recovery program provides rides to patients

Patient Lodging Programs

Getting the best care sometimes means cancer patients must travel away from home. This can place an extra emotional and financial burden on patients and caregivers during an already challenging time. The American Cancer Society is trying to make this difficult situation easier for both cancer patients and their families through Hope Lodge and our Hotel Partners Program.
